

# neonatal resuscitation & care

As if we as EMS providers don't stress enough in critical situations involving pediatrics, add into the situation a neonate! "Fresh out of the oven"...or pretty close to it...neonates need to be treated differently than infants, toddlers, and adolescents. Relying solely on what you learned in your primary education and training doesn't do justice to the intensity and stress that is added in these critical situations!

While courses like ACLS, PALS, PEARS, and PEPP do a good job to cover drug doses, general assessment, and "electric therapy," they don't cover them very well for this specific population. Designed after the American Heart Association (AHA) and American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) course, this smaller course focuses on the primary roles of EMS providers in neonatal resuscitation & care situations.

## ***BIG problems for itty bitty people***

Designed for both BLS and ALS providers, this course can be delivered to services with a combination of providers. Topics such as neonatal patient assessment, vital signs, IV therapy & medication administration, and umbilical venous access are discussed and emphasized according to participant provider levels. When seconds really count, you don't want to rely solely on flip charts, spin-wheels, or measuring devices to give you the valuable information that you need! This course will provide you with the valuable important information that applies to neonatal resuscitation & care.

*A great lead-up to this course is our Pediatric Assessment & Care for the EMT Provider course (2 hours), which is designed specifically for EMT & AEMT providers (EMRs are also welcome!).*

*While this course provides a great overview of neonatal resuscitation and care, it is still highly recommended for ALS providers to take a full NRP course.*
